

AWARDS FOR EXCELLENCE

HALIBURTON HIGHLANDS HONOUR SOCIETY

In 1972, the Haliburton Highlands Secondary School Scholarship Fund inaugurated the Haliburton Highlands Honour Society. To achieve membership in the Honour Society, a student must achieve first class honours for **four consecutive years**.

A Certificate of Membership in the Haliburton Highlands Honour Society is presented to each student who achieves this outstanding accomplishment, along with a specially engraved plate for his/her Honour Plaque.

Students must attend the Haliburton Highlands Secondary School for a minimum of two years in order to be eligible for membership in the Honour Society.

THE ONTARIO SCHOLARSHIP

Grade and Level: Year 4
Recipient: The award will be presented to any graduating student who obtains a total of at least 480 marks in a combination of six approved courses and who has been recommended for the Ontario Secondary School Diploma.
Award: An Ontario Scholar certificate

THE ROTARY CLUB OF MINDEN SCHOLARSHIP

Established by the Rotary Club of Minden

Grade and Level: Year 4
Recipient: The award will be presented to a graduate who has demonstrated good academic achievement, together with active participation in athletic and/or extracurricular activities, during his or her years at H.H.S.S.
Award: \$540

THE MARTHA STEEN MEMORIAL AWARD

Established by Mrs. Maude Steen and supported by Mr. Wayne Cooper and the Dibblee Family

Grade and Level: Year 4
Recipient: The recipient of this award will have demonstrated exceptional talent in any area, all the while enlivened by a delightful sense of humour.
Award: \$700

Memorial:

Martha Steen was a popular teacher and coach at H.H.S.S. in the 1990s. A talented actress, singer, and very funny woman – no one better exemplified the two theatrical masks, comedy and tragedy, in her own life.

THE GLORIA LEMIEUX AWARDS

Grade and Level: Year 4
Recipient: Four awards will be presented to deserving graduates who are pursuing post-secondary education and who have demonstrated outstanding contributions to school life.
Award: \$800 for each student

THE PRINCIPAL'S AWARDS FOR STUDENT LEADERSHIP

Grade and Level: Year 4
Recipient: The awards will be presented to **two students**, one male and one female, who have demonstrated excellent leadership and citizenship in dealing with students and staff.
Awards: \$150 for each recipient

THE LODENQUAI SCHOLARSHIP

Established by Dr. and Mrs. Jeffrey W. Lodenquai, formerly of Minden

Grade and Level: Year 4 University
Recipient: The award will be presented to a graduating student who is proceeding to further education at a university, and who achieves the second highest overall average in Year 4.
Award: \$300

THE F.D. HERLIHEY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established by the late F. Harold Herlihey, Wilberforce

Grade and Level: Year 4 University
Recipient: The award will be presented to a graduating student who is pursuing post-secondary studies at a university, and who achieves the highest overall average in Year 4.
Award: \$140

Memorial:

This award was established by Mr. Herlihey in loving memory of his father, F. D. Herlihey, who was one of the pioneer businessmen of Haliburton County. This award was first presented in 1959, and was the first Scholarship to be given at H.H.S.S.

THE GOVERNOR GENERAL'S ACADEMIC MEDAL

Presented by the Governor General of Canada

Grade and Level: Year 4 University
Recipient: The award will be presented to the student who achieves the highest academic standing in the graduating class.
Award: The Governor General's Bronze Medal
