Memorial:

This award was established by Mr. Curry in loving memory of his late father, W. R. Curry, who with his wife, the former Jesse Ellen Barr, moved to Haliburton in 1906. Here he operated a livery stable, an automobile dealership, and a lumbering operation. Mr. Curry was deeply involved in the affairs of the community, having been Councillor, Reeve and Warden. He was an elder of the Presbyterian Church and, after union, of the United Church, the first Chairman of the Dysart Telephone System, and of the Red Cross Outpost. He was also an active member of the Crippled Children's Society, the Rotary Club of Haliburton, and the Masonic Lodge. The lectern used in this school was presented by Mr. Curry at the school's opening in 1953.
